Note that in all cases, it is the customer's responsibility to select textiles which do not contain the following:

- 1. Formaldehyde.
- 2. Perfluorinated Compounds (PFC's)
- 3. Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC), avoid PVC-based upholstery products.
- 4. Antimicrobials. Customers are responsible for, and must choose appropriate textiles and pay attention to chemical content prior to ordering.
- 5. Flame Retardants. Customers must select appropriate textiles prior to ordering, as many textiles contain them. If we are to meet the City of Boston and/or CAL 133 fire codes, then meeting the HH standard is not possible.

Check the HH website for textile vendors and products who have tested to meet the above.
